said four Years instead of the sum paid or agreed for a  
adjudged to be paid within that period by the Crown or Comptrolers  
of Land in said Parish for and in respect of Rectorial Tithes  
and that in such Unreasonable and Unjust cause of  
proceeding they struck the average of Rectorial Tithes for said  
Seven Years at the Sum of One Hundred and Sixty two pounds  
ten Shillings and which appeared to be inconsistent of the  
average of said Rectorial Tithes at the Sum of One  
Hundred and forty Pounds per Annum, altho said Rectorial  
Tithes were declared by said Certificate to be only Equal to  
one Third the amount of the Rectorial Tithes.

And Whereas Notice of such Appeal having been duly  
given to all Persons concerned therein the said Appeal in  
pursuance of an Order duly made and Notice duly given  
for that purpose came on to be heard by Us the said Lord  
Lieutenant and Council on the Twenty sixth day of July  
in the said Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Twenty four  
in the presence of Counsel learned in the Law on behalf  
of the said Appellant and no other person having a standing  
thereat and thereupon the said Appeal and Certificate  
and the matter thereof respectively and such Evidence as was  
offered concerning the Premises having been heard and duly  
considered by Us the said Lord Lieutenant and Council
