all tithes whatsoever, within the said parish, is
Sixty six pounds, six Shillings, & one penny
three farthings, which sum of Sixty six
pounds, six Shillings, & one penny three
farthings, is due & payable to the Bishop,
of the Diocese, & I do further certify, that
