

I have by virtue of the Statute in regard to tithes which after the 24th day of July 1825 - twenty six

Mr William Burke of Ballymagan, and
John Allman of Eyecourt, in the County of
Galway, Esqrs. Commissioners duly appointed and
sworn, under and by virtue of an Act made in
the 25th year of the reign of King George the 4th
(intituled an Act to provide for the establishing
of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited
time,) to ascertain and fix a true and just compo-
sition for all tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable
within the Parish of Carrillick in the County of Galway,
do hereby certify, that the true and just amount
of Composition for all tithes whatever ^{within the said}
Parish is one hundred and two pounds ten shillings
per year, of what sum of one hundred and two pounds
ten shillings - Twenty pounds Ster. are due and
payable to Denis Power, as a composition for all
tithes payable to him, as Rector of said Parish and his
successors - Thirty pounds Ster. are due and payable
to Thomas Hawkins, as ^{Dean of Moypat.} and his successors.
Twenty Seven Pound Ster. are due and payable to
the Rev. Mr. Garty as a composition of Donnybeg and
his successors, Twenty five Pound Ster. are due and
payable to the Rev. Mr. O'Connell as a composition
of Ballymulla and his successors - We do further
certify that the average price of oats being the corn principally
grown in such County for the period of seven years
ending on the first day of Novem: 1821 - is ten shillings
& 6 by the barrel - Signed & Declared this
