

Average of the sums agreed for and paid the Reverend Daniel Sullivan for seven years preceding the 1st day of November 1830 increased by one fifth (the utmost the Act allows) and Two Hundred and twenty one pounds ten shillings and four pence are due and payable to His Grace the Duke of Devonshire as Lay Incumbent, being the average of the sums agreed for and paid to his Grace for the seven years successively preceding the first day of Nov. 1830 - increased by one fifth the utmost the Act allows / the average of the said sums not appearing to have been an adequate composition for the tithes of the several articles on which such sums have been paid and agreed for, And I do further certify, that the average price of oats being the corn principally grown in this County for the period of seven years ending on the first day of November 1830 is twelve shillings and eleven pence per Bushell

And Whereas Two several Appeals have been duly made to the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland in Council, One by His Grace the Most Noble William Spencer Duke of Devonshire and the other by the Rev^d Daniel Sullivan, Vicar of the said Parish, against the composition stated in the said Certificate as due and payable to them respectively, that is for the Incumbent tithes of said Parish to the said Duke of Devonshire, and for the vicarial tithes for the said Rev^d Daniel Sullivan; and notices of such Appeals having been duly given, the said Appeals in pursuance of Orders for that purpose came on to be heard in the presence of Counsel learned in the Law appearing on behalf of the said Appellants and of the Parishioners as Respondents and thereupon the said Appeals and Certificate and the matter thereof having been heard. - It is this Day, that is to say, Wednesday the Ninth Day of April One thousand eight hundred and thirty four, Ordered by the Lord Lieutenant by and with the Advice and Consent of the Privy Council of Ireland and upon the consent thereto of the parties Appellant and Respondent in this matter, given in open Court at the said Hearing of the said Appeals by their respective Counsel, that the amount of the composition stated in the said Certificate as due and payable to His Grace the Most Noble William Spencer Duke of Devonshire as a composition for the Lay, Incumbent tithes of the said Parish of Kilmoran be increased to the sum of Two Hundred and Eighty Nine pounds.
