Appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth  
year of the Reign of King George the fourth Entitled an Act to provide for  
the Establishing of Compositions for tithes in Ireland for a limited time  
to Ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all tithes arising  
growing yielded or payable within the parish of Kilrossanty in the Diocese  
of Lismore and County of Waterford Do hereby Certify that the true and  
Just ~~Composition~~ amount of Composition for all tithes whatever within the  
said parish is Six hundred pounds by the year of which sum of Six  
hundred pounds two third parts thereof are due and payable to Thomas  
McGuire Esquire as a Composition for the tithe claimable by him as Lessee  
of the rectorial tithes of said parish and one third part of said Six hundred  
pounds is due and payable to the Reverend John Bourke Wallace  
the vicar of the said parish and we do further Certify that the average  
price of oats being the Corn principally grown in such County for the  
period of seven years ending on the first day of November 1821 is  
fourteen Shillings and one farthing per barrel. Dated this tenth day of  
October 1824.
