

We Arthur W. Cooper & John Camsby Commissioners duly appointed
therein under the virtue of an Act made in the Fourth Year of the
Reign of King George the Fourth entitled "An Act to provide es-
tablishing of Compositions for tithes in Ireland for a limited time"
to ascertain & fix a true & just composition for all tithes arising, growing,
yielded, or payable within the Parish of Killcross in the County of
Sligo. Do hereby certify that the Lay Impropriator has not
compounded for the Rectorial tithes of said Parish: but that the
true & just amount of Composition for all the Vicarial tithes what-
ever within the said Parish is Forty five pounds by the Year:
And that the said Sum of Forty five pounds is due & payable
to the Rev. Thomas Hackett as a composition for the tithes claim-
able by him as Vicar of the said Parish. And we do
further testify that the Average price of Oats being the Corn
principally grown in said County, for the period of seven Years ending
on the first day of November 1821, is fifteen Shillings & two pence
farthing of Barrel.
