We Henry Bagge and John Hearn Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the Fourth year of the Reign of King George the Fourth entitled an Act to provide for the Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time, to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising growing yielded or payable within the Parish of Kilbruske in the Diocese of Lismore and County of Waterford, Do hereby Certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is One Hundred and fifty two Pounds six Shillings and three pence British, by the Year of which sum of One Hundred and fifty two Pounds six Shillings and three pence, two third parts thereof are due and payable to the Venerable Archdeacon Philip Ryan a Composition for the Tithe claimable by him as Rector of said Parish and one third part of said sum of One Hundred and fifty two Pounds six Shillings and three pence British is due and payable to the said Venerable Archdeacon Philip Ryan as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by him as Vicar of said Parish and we further Certify that the average price of Oats being the Corn principally grown in such County for the period of seven years ending on the first day of November 1821 is fifteen Shillings and two pence farthing per Barrel, Given under our Hands, this fourth day of October one thousand eight Hundred and twenty five,
