establishing of Composition for all tithes in Ireland
for a limited time to ascertain and fix a true and
just Composition for all tithes arising growing yields
or payable within the Parish of Kilrush in the County
of Wexford do hereby Certify that a true and just amount
of Composition for all tithes whatever within the said
Parish is Seven Hundred and Fifty two pounds by the
year which sum of Seven Hundred and Fifty two
Pounds is due and payable to the Reverend Walter
Hore as a Composition for the tithes claimable by him
as Rector of the said Parish —

And We do further certify that the
Average price of Barrels (as appears by the Return of the
Dublin Gazette) being the Corn principally grown
in such Parish of the Period of Seven years ending
on the First Day of November One thousand Eight
Hundred and Twenty One is fifteen shillings and two
pence halfpenny per Barrel — 24 April 1824
