

John Edward Longford having been appointed and sworn a
Commissioner under and by virtue of an Act made in the
second and third years of the Reign of His Majesty King
William the fourth to amend and make permanent the
acts made in the seventh and eighth years of His late
Majesty King George the fourth providing for the establish-
ment of a Commission for Tithes in Ireland to ascertain and
fix a true and just composition for all Tithes arising
growing yielding or payable within the Parish of Kilscurran
in the County of Wickford and in the Diocese of Fermagh

I do certify that the true and just amount of composition
for all Tithes whatever in said Parish is Two Hundred &
twenty six pounds seventeen Shillings and ten pence
half penny Sterling by the year according to the average
of the seven years preceeding Nov^r 1830 are due
and payable to the Rev^d Charles R. O'Riordan, Dⁿ as
a composition for the Tithes claimed by him as Rector
of said Parish

And I do further certify that the average price
of Oats (as taken from the Dublin Gazette) for the seven
years preceeding Nov^r 1830 is as follows Viz Wheat
~~one pound twelve shillings and six halfpenny Sterling per~~
~~barrel and Oats twelve shillings and eleven pence half~~
penny per barrel being the Corn principally grown in this
County - given under my hand this first day of July
