a Commissioner, duly appointed and sworn, under and by virtue of an Act made in the Second and Third Year, of the Reign of, King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend Three Acts passed respectively in the Fourth, Fifth, and in the Seventh and Eighth Years of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, providing for the Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such Compositions permanent;" to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded, or payable within the Parish of Kiltel in the County of Kildare Do hereby Certify that the true and just Amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever, within the said Parish, is Ninety eight pounds sixteen shillings and two pence half penny by the Year, of which Sum of Ninety eight pounds sixteen shillings and two pence half penny a third part amounting to Thirty two pounds sixteen shillings and eight pence is due and payable to The Rev^d Geo^r W^m Moore as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by Him as Vicar of the Said parish and the remaining two third part, then amounting to Sixty five pounds sixteen shillings and four pence is due and payable to Mr. Eliz^a Coogan as Lessee of Lieutenant Colonel Lutie Allen the Vicar of the Vicarial Tithes of the said parish

And I do hereby Certify that the average price of Oats being the Corn principally grown in such County, for the period of Seven Years, ending on the 1st day of November, 1830, is Nineteen Shillings and three pence four farthings per Barrel.
