a Commissioner, duly appointed and sworn, under and by virtue of an Act made in the Second and Third Year of the Reign of King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend Three Acts passed respectively in the Fourth, Fifth, and in the Seventh and Eighth Years of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, providing for the Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such Compositions permanent," to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded, or payable within the Parish of *Kilteel* in the County of *Kildare* ----- Do hereby Certify that the true

and just Amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever, within the said Parish, is ninety-eight pounds sixteen shillings and two-pence halfpenny ----- by the Year, of which Sum of ninety-eight pounds sixteen shillings and two pence halfpenny one-third part is due and payable to the Reverend Ogle William Nassau a Composition for the Tithe claimable by Him -----

as Vicar of the said Parish and the remaining two-third parts thereof are due and payable to Mrs Eliza Coogan as Lessee of Lieutenant Colonel Luke Allen the owner of the Rectorial Tithes of the said Parish -----

And I do hereby Certify that the average price of Oats being the Corn principally grown in such County, for the period of Seven Years, ending on the 1st day of November, 1830, is thirteen shillings and three pence three farthings per Barrel.
