

which certificate the gross amount of composition for all Tithes whatever in said parish was ascertained to be the annual sum of one hundred and seventy six pounds three shillings and nine pence halfpenny of which sum the sum of fifty eight pounds fourteen shillings and seven pence farthing was certified to be due and payable to George Luttrell as Representative of John Luttrell deceased Lessee of the Rev^d Hamilton Morgan Vicar of said parish as a composition for all Tithes claimed by him and that the sum of one hundred and seventeen pounds nine shillings and two pence farthing was payable to Robert Shepland Carver as Lay Impropriator of said parish and it was thereby further certified that the average price of wheat being corn principally grown in said County for the period of seven years ending 1st November 1830 was one pound twelve shillings and one half penny per barrell And Whereas the said Robert Godolphin Cosby William Kemmis and Arthur Kemmis made application in writing to the Justices of the Peace at the Quarter Sessions above mentioned to have the average price of wheat per barrell

(being the grain in said certificate mentioned) for the preceding seven years in pursuance of the statutes in that behalf enquired of and ascertained in order that said composition for tithes and the tithe rent charge payable in lieu thereof might be varied and diminished according to such average price taken from the Dublin Gazette for such period as compared with the average price of one pound twelve shillings and one halfpenny per barrell as set forth in said certificate And Whereas the said applicants having appeared in person and by their agent before the said Justices and the said notices of application and said certificate and the right of said applicants to have said composition for Tithes and Tithe Rent charge in lieu thereof varied & diminished having been proved and established to our satisfaction. Now the said Justices do ascertain from the said Dublin Gazette that the average price of wheat for seven years immediately preceding the date hereof is seventeen shillings and five pence three farthings for each barrell of twenty stone of wheat as aforesaid and the said Justices do accordingly order and adjudge
