I William Hampton Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the Second and Third year of King William the Fourth entitled an Act to amend three acts passed respectively in the Fourth Fifth and in the Seventh and Eighth years of the Reign of his late Majesty King George the Fourth providing for the Establishing of composition for Tithes in Ireland and to make such composition permanent to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all Tithes arising growing yielding or payable within the Parish of Killteeven in the County of Roscommon do certify that the True and just amount of composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is One Hundred and Fifteen Pounds from Shillings and Eight pence Sterling by the Year - Of which sum of One Hundred and Fifteen Pounds Four shillings and Eight pence Sterling Sixty five Pounds Four Shillings and Eight pence is due and payable to Miss Richd Armstrong, Charles Armstrong and Richd Armstrong Junior as a Compensation for the Tithes claimed by them as owners of or as Say Improrietors and the remaining sum of Fifty Pounds Sterling is due and payable to the Revd Thomas Blakeney as Vicar of said Parish And I do further certify that the average price of wheat for the Seven Years commencing 1st Nov 1823

ending on the 1st Nov 1830 is One Pound Twelve shillings and one halfpenny Sterling And that the average price of Oats for the Seven Years commencing first Nov 1823 and ending 1st Nov 1830 is Twelve shillings and Eleven pence Halfpenny Sterling as taken from the Dublin Gazette
