duly appointed and sworn, under, and by virtue of an Act of Second and Third William the Fourth, intituled an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the Fourth, Fifth, and in the Seventh and Eighth Years of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, providing for the establishing of Composition of Tithes in Ireland; and to make such Composition permanent, and to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of *Mellisrock in the Diocese of Raphoe* in the County of *Derry* do hereby certify, that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatsoever, within said Parish is *One Hundred and Twenty Six pounds Sterling by Mutual agreement* by the Year, of which Sum of *One Hundred and Twenty Six pounds Sterling* ~~one half~~ is due and payable to *Edw. Edward*

*Chancellor* for Composition claimed by him as ~~Perpetual Curate, and one half is due and payable to~~

*Dean of Raphoe* ~~Vicar of the said Parish~~; and I do further certify that the average price of Oats, being the Corn principally grown in said County for the period of Seven Years, ending on the First day of November, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirty, is *Twelve Shillings and Eleven pence* Sterling per Barrel.
