

To all to whom these presents shall come I Edward Chichester Dean of Raphoe  
Rector and Vicar of the Parish of Killeevagh in the Diocese of Raphoe send Greeting  
Whereas pursuant to the provisions of an act passed in the 2<sup>d</sup> & 3<sup>d</sup> years of the reign of his  
present Majesty King William the fourth entitled an act to amend three acts passed  
respectively in the 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> and in the 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> years of the reign of his late Majesty  
King George the fourth providing for the Establishment of Compositions for tithes  
in Ireland and to make such Compositions permanent Charles Style of Glenmore  
in the County of Donegal has duly served me with a notice in writing in the words  
and figures following:

Sir, you are hereby required to take notice that in pursuance of an act  
passed in the second and third years of the reign of his Majesty King William the fourth entitled  
an act to amend three acts passed respectively in the fourth fifth and in the seventh and  
eighth years of the reign of his late Majesty King George the fourth providing for the establishing  
of compositions for tithes in Ireland and to make such compositions permanent I Charles Style of  
Glenmore in the County of Donegal Chief landlord seized in fee simple of all that & those the lands  
now known under the several denominations and subdenominations of Meenahorney called Legamin  
Largmalore Welshstown Ballinatonr Aughray Meenagrave Louphralough Allimpaste Cloughmaddy  
Cronamuck Cronacarry Curtickmahon Mayhrecloy Letterhillow otherwise Stringarrow otherwise  
Stringibagh Stringally Ballykerrigan Drumderrydoan Binmore Derryogh Crolicki Glopayh  
Devitt Botsapatrik Falgarow Altatraught and part of Ballinaman together with the three  
Townlands of Letterbrick Ballybotemple & Ballybolamy held under the see of Raphoe the  
metes and bounds whereof are as follow that is to say bounded on the north by the Parish of Raphoe  
and the property of Sir Thomas Charles Style Bart. on the south by the Parishes of Tillymard  
Donegal and Stanorlar on the west by the Parish of Innishiel and the property of Sir Thomas  
Charles Style Bart. on the east by the parish of Raphoe Stanorlar and that part of the parish  
of Killeevagh known by the name of the Two Curries situated in the parish of Killeevagh  
Barony of Raphoe and County of Donegal or being otherwise entitled according to the provisions of the  
said act to agree for and undertake the payment of the composition for tithes lawfully payable  
for and in respect of the said lands do hereby signify to you my desire to agree for & undertake  
the payment of such composition as may be appointed on the said lands by virtue of an  
agreement entered into by you and the parish of Killeevagh at a Vestry held under the provisions  
of an act of the fourth and fifth years of George the fourth on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of November last and at  
which the composition for the tithes of the said Parish was agreed for at £126 per annum  
and I hereby require you to grant to me a Certificate in writing conformable to the provisions  
of the said act declaring me entitled to the benefit of this notice and to perform the other matters  
on your part required by the said act to be done Dated this 12<sup>th</sup> day of February 1833
