

I William Shanly Commissioner duly appointed and sworn, under and by virtue of an Act made in the second and third years of the Reign of King William the Fourth, intituled, "an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the fourth fifth and in the seventh and eighth years of the Reign of his late Majesty King George the Fourth, providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland", and to make such Compositions permanent, to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes, arising, growing, yielded, or payable within the Parish of Killohork, in the County of Lectrim, do hereby Certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish, is Six Hundred and one pound Sterling, by the Year; being the average of the seven Years preceeding the first November one Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirty, which Sum of Six Hundred and one pound is due and payable to the Reverend Thomas Jones, as a Composition for all Tithes claimable by him, as Rector and Vicar of said Parish.
