Whereas a Certificate for the Parish of Kinnegh in the Diocese of Dublin was lodged with the Registrar of the said Diocese and now appears and is entered in the Registry of the said Diocese in the words and figures following To Wit "We Joseph Fishbourne and Wm Young Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the 4<sup>th</sup> Year of the Reign of King George the 4<sup>th</sup> entitled an Act to provide for Establishing of Composition for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time and also of one other Act made in the 5<sup>th</sup> Year of the Reign of his said Majesty, King George the 4<sup>th</sup> entitled an Act to amend an Act of the last Session of Parliament for providing for the Establishing of Composition of Tithes in Ireland to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising growing yielding or payable within the Parish of Kinnegh, in the Counties of Kildare and Carlow Do hereby certify, that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is Four Hundred and three pounds ten shillings and eleven pence by the year of which sum ~~one~~ third of that sum that is payable or to be raised off the Lands of Caragen in the said Parish of Kinnegh and County of Kildare are due and payable to His Grace the Duke of Leinster being Twenty one pounds seventeen shillings and nine pence as Lay Impropriator or Lord of the Soil, of the sum that is to be raised off the Lands of Ricketstown in said Parish and County of Carlow, one third are due and payable to Hugh Cumming Esq as Lay Impropriator or Lord of the Soil being Fourteen pounds eleven shillings and seven pence, And also one third of that sum that is to be raised off the Lands of Rathdaniel in said Parish and County of Carlow are due and payable to John D Duckett Esq as Lay Impropriator or Lord of the Soil being £ 22 .. 18. 9 - 1/2 and also one third of the sum that is to be raised off the Lands of Cabally, Newtown and Ballycolea in the County of Kildare and Ballyhackett and Philipstown in the County of Carlow due and payable out of the Lands of Ricketstown and Rathdaniel in <sup>the said</sup> County and one third of two thirds of Caragen in the County Kildare, all in said Parish of Kinnegh to the Lord Bishop of Kildare for which his Lordship has agreed to take Eighty pounds yearly and also one third of the sum that is to be raised off the Lands of Cabally, Newtown and Ballycolea in the County of Kildare and Ballyhackett and Philipstown in the County of Carlow And one third of two thirds due and payable out of the Lands of Ricketstown and Rathdaniel in said County, and one third of two thirds of Caragen in the County Kildare all in said Parish
