the County of Cork do hereby certify that the true and  
just amount of Composition for all the tithes what-  
soever within the said parish of Kinsale is Thirty  
three Pounds two Shillings and sixpence by the year  
of which sixteen Pounds eleven Shillings and three  
pence are due and payable to the Reverend  
James Thomas Brown as vicar of the said Parish  
and that the Remainder sixteen Pounds eleven  
Shillings and three pence are due and payable to  
Thos Cuthbert Kearney Esq as Lay impropriator of  
the said parish and I do further certify that  
the average price of <sup>corn</sup> wheat being the principal  
grown in this ~~County~~, for the period of seven years  
ending the 1 day November 1830 is one Pound 12/10
