

We Daniel Sullivan of Tomies and Francis Walker of Lisc
Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under, and by
virtue of an act or acts passed in the fourth and fifth
Years of the Reign of his present Majesty George the Fourth
Entituled an Act to provide for the establishing of Com-
positions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time to
ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all tithes
arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of
Knockmore in the County of Kerry and united Parishes of
Ardfert and Aghadoe, Do certify that the true and just
amount of Composition in lieu of all tithes that has
been hitherto received by the Rev Edward Fitzgerald Curator
Rector out of said Parish is two hundred and sixty pounds
British Currency which is to be unvariable for a term
of Twenty one Years as directed under said acts of
Parliament, and we do further certify that the
average price of Oats (being the Corn principally grown
within the County of Kerry aforesaid) for the period
of seven Years ending the first day of November 1821
is fifteen Shillings and two Pence farthing per barrel
