John Pops Commissioner, duly appointed and sworn, under and by virtue of an Act made in the second and third years of the reign of King William the fourth (entituled an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the fourth, fifth, and in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of his late Majesty King George the fourth, providing for the establishing of Composition for tithes in Ireland and to make such Composition permanent) to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all tithes, arising, growing, yielded, or payable, within the Parish of Buoellmoun in the County of Cork, do hereby certify, that the true and just amount of Composition for all tithes, whatever within the said Parish is Two Thousand and Seventy pounds twelve shillings and nine pence Sterling, of which ^{by the year 1830} sum of Two Thousand and Seventy pounds, twelve shillings and nine pence Sterling, the half part is due and payable to the Rev^d Thomas Champion B. D. as a Composition for the tithes claimed by him as Vicar of the said Parish, and the other half is due and payable to the Corporation of Waterford as Lay Impropriators of the said Parish, and I do further certify, that the average price of oats, being the corn principally grown in such County for the period of seven years, ending on the first day of November 1830, is twelve shillings and eleven pence half penny per barrel
