

J. John Robt. Commissioner, duly appointed and sworn  
under and by virtue of an Act made in the second and  
third years of the reign of King William the fourth  
(intituled an Act to Amend three Acts passed respectively  
in the fourth, fifth, and in the seventh and eighth years  
of the reign of his late Majesty King George the fourth  
providing for the establishing of Composition for Tithes  
in Ireland and to make such Composition permanent)  
to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for  
all tithes, arising, growing, yielded, or payable, within  
the Parish of Kinockinowan in the County of Cork,  
As hereby certify that the true and just <sup>amount of</sup> Composition  
for all tithes, whatever within the said Parish is the  
Thousand and Seventy pounds twelve shillings and  
twelve <sup>namely the year</sup> ~~of~~ <sup>at</sup> which sum of One Thousand and Seventy pounds  
twelve shillings and nine pence, Five hundred and  
thirty five pounds six shillings and four pence halfpenny  
one ~~half~~ part, are due and payable to the Rev<sup>d</sup>.  
Thomas Campion D.D. as a Composition for the tithes  
claimed by him as Vicar of the said Parish, and  
one half is due and payable to the Corporation of  
Waterford as Lay Impropriators of the said Parish,  
and I do further certify that the average price of  
Oats being the corn principally grown in such County  
for the period of seven years, ending on the first day  
of November 1830 is twelve shillings and eleven pence  
halfpenny per Barrel -
