W<sup>m</sup> Devaynes Smith of Bloncen in the County of Tipperary Esquire and the Rev<sup>d</sup> William Parker Fry of Leipsic in the Kings County Clerk Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the Reign of King George the fourth Intituled an Act to provide for the Establishing of Compositions for tithes in Ireland for a limited time, to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all tithes arising growing yielded or payable within the Parish of Kyle situate in the Queens County. do hereby Certify that a Special Vestry for said Parish duly qualified and assembled as directed by said Act did on the 3<sup>d</sup> day of November 1823 agree to and with the Reverend Thomas LeStrange Clerk Rector and Vicar of said Parish of Kyle that he the said Reverend Thomas LeStrange should receive the annual fixed Sum of One hundred and twenty One pounds three Shillings and three pence Sterling as the amount of the Composition to be paid to him for all tithes in the said Parish of Kyle and that he the said Reverend Thomas LeStrange should receive the annual fixed Sum of One hundred and twenty One pounds three Shillings and three pence Sterling as the amount of the Composition to be paid to him for all tithes in the said Parish of Kyle. and that the said Sum is not below the average amount of the Sums actually paid out of and upon the said Parish of Kyle for all the tithes thereof for the seven years preceding the first day of November 1821- and that the true and just amount of Composition for all tithes whatever within said Parish of Kyle is One hundred and Twenty One pounds three Shillings and three pence Sterling agreed upon as aforesaid by the Year. the whole of which
