 Edward "an act to provide for the Establishing of Compositions
 for tithes in Ireland for a limited time" to ascertain and fix
 a true and just Composition for all tithes arising growing
 yielded & payable within the Parish of Luckin in the County
 of Westmeath. Do hereby certify that the true and just amt.
 of Composition for all tithes whatever within the said Parish is
 One hundred forty four p^{r} fifteen Shillings & six pence
 by the year. And we further certify that the average price
 of grain being the Corn principally grown in such County for
 the period of seven years next preceding the first of November
 one thousand eight hundred and twenty one is fifteen shillings
 and two pence per bushel as appears from the
 Returns of the District Survey. Dated 7th September 1824
