

J. Rande Patrick Mardonell, Commissioner,  
 duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue  
 of an Act made in the second and third years  
 of the Reign of King William the fourth, intitled  
 "An Act to amend three Acts, passed respectively  
 in the fourth, fifth and seventh years of the  
 Reign of his late Majesty King George the fourth  
 providing for the establishing of Composition for  
 Tithes in Ireland and to make such Compo-  
 sition permanent," to ascertain and fix a true  
 and just Composition for all tithes arising, grow-  
 ing, yielded or payable within the Parish  
 of Sackem in the County of Cork, do hereby  
 certify that the true and just amount of  
 composition for all tithes whatever within the  
 said Parish is thirty one Pounds sterling by  
 the year, which sum of thirty one Pounds is  
 due and payable to the Rev. Ben Burton  
 Johnston, the Parson of the said Parish,  
 as a Composition for the Tithes claimable  
 by him

And I do further certify that the ave-  
 rage price of wheat being the Corn principally  
 grown in the said County, for the period  
 of seven years ending on the first day of  
 November 1830 is one Pound twelve Shillings  
 and one half-penny sterling per Acre
