

Tithe Composition

Parish of Ladytown.

I John Symes having been duly appointed and sworn as Commissioner under and by Virtue of an Act made in the Fourth Year of the Reign of King George the Fourth intituled "an Act to provide for the Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time" And by Virtue of an Act passed in the Second and Third Years of the Reign of His Majesty King William the Fourth intituled "An Act to amend Three Acts passed, respectively, in the Fourth Fifth, and in the Seventh and Eight Years of the reign of his late Majesty King George the Fourth providing for the Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland and to make such Compositions permanent, and to ascertain and fix a True and just Composition for all Tithes arising growing, yielded or payable within the parish of Ladytown Barony of Great Connell and County of Kildare; Do hereby Certify That the True and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said parish is Ninety five pounds Nine Shillings and Six pence Sterling, by the Year, out of which amount The sum of Thirty one pounds Sixteen Shillings and Six pence is due and payable to the Reverend Mathias Crowley as Vicar and owner of the Vicarial Tithes of said parish of Ladytown, And also the sum of Nineteen pounds Seven Shillings and five pence $\frac{1}{3}$ is payable to Andrew Bourke Esqr as owner of the Rectorial Tithes arising out of the Townland of Newhall in said parish, and also the further sum of Twenty five pounds four Shillings and five pence $\frac{2}{3}$ is payable to Sir Thomas Molyneux Bart as owner of the Rectorial Tithes arising out of the Townland of Ladytown, And also a further sum of Twelve pounds Three Shillings and Nine pence $\frac{1}{3}$ is payable to the said Sir Thomas Molyneux Bart arising out of the Townland of Lewistown in said parish, and a further Sum of Six pounds Seventeen Shillings and Six pence $\frac{2}{3}$.
