

I Richard Wood, Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under and by
Virtue of an Act made in the Fourth Year of the Reign of King George
the 4th intituled an Act to provide for the Establishing of Compositions for
Tithes in Ireland for a limited time Chapter 99, and also by Virtue of
an Act made in the Reign of William the 4th intituled an Act to
amend three Acts passed respectively in the Fourth, Fifth and in the
seventh and Eighth Years of the Reign of his late Majesty King
George the Fourth providing for the establishing of Composition for Tithes in
Ireland, and to make such Composition permanent, to ascertain and fix
a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielding or
payable within the Parish of Seck in the County Donegal, do hereby
Certify that the true and just Amount of Composition for all Tithes
whatever within the said Parish is Three Hundred and Twenty four
Pounds Sterg by the Year, which Sum of Three Hundred and Twenty
four Pounds, are due and payable to the Rev^d Lord Edward Chichester
as a Composition for the Tithes claimed by him as Rector and Vicar of
said Parish. And I do further Certify that the Average price of Oats
being the Corn principally grown in said County for the period of seven
Years ending on the 1st day of November 1830 is twelve Shillings
and eleven pence half penny per Barrel.
