

My Lord,

I beg leave to give you notice pursuant to the provisions of the Statute made in the 2nd & 3rd years of the reign of His Present Majesty King William the Fourth entitled an Act to Amend three Acts passed respectively in the 4th, 5th, 7th & 8th of George the Fourth providing for the Establishment of Composition for Tithes in Ireland and to make such Composition permanent. That I am desirous to agree for and undertake as provided by the said Act the future payment of the tithes Composition, issuable and payable out of the Townlands of Dooballa, Middle Dooballa, Praitownaenny, Knockbrack Longey, Listillon Aughtlana, Maghrilroy, Bluck and Mumarda situated in the Parish of Lick and County of Donegal. Bounded on the North by the River Suilly, on the South by Cortey, Mill Town and Mileraggy, on the East by the River and on the West by the Parish of Raphoe.

First deducting the fifteen per cent on the Amount and I hereby require you in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act to grant me with all convenient speed a Certificate under hand and Seal of the Import required by the said Act, and in order that I may execute under my hand and Seal the Declaration of the Import required by the said Act, and annex thereto a Map or ground plan of the Lands charged with the Composition and give your further notice that I am the Chief Landlord or Lessee, seized in the fee simple of the Rent of said Lands, and am ready to give you any further information in relation thereto, which you may require.
