shillings by the year and payable to the  
Rev<sup>d</sup> John Forsyth as a Composition for the tithes  
claimable by him as Rector and Vicar of the said  
Parish

And we do further certify that the average price of  
wheat being the Corn principally grown in such  
County for the period of seven years ending on the first  
day of November 1821 is One Pound sixteen shillings  
and eight pence halfpenny per Barrel  
To the Churchwardens of  
the Parish of Leighinney  
or Leffoney

And the undersigned Special Jury men duly qualified  
to vote under the above mentioned acts do hereby  
approve of the above Certificate and that the sum of  
one hundred and ten pounds five shillings be paid  
annually to the Rev<sup>d</sup> John Forsyth as Rector and Vicar  
of said Parish in full and full satisfaction of all tithes  
arising yielding or growing due to him and that it shall
