certify that the true and just amount of composition
for all Tythes whatsoever within the said parish
is Seventy four ¹¹ pounds five shillings and ten pence
fifty nine pounds five shillings & ten pence and due
& payable to the Rev^d John Armstrong Rector and
Vicar of said parish, and fifteen pounds sterling
are due & payable to the Lord Bishop of Clonfert
~~the same~~ And we do further certify that the average
price of oats, being the corn principally grown in
said County for the period of seven years ending on the
first day of Nov. 1821 is fifteen shillings and ^{two} ~~four~~ pence
halfpenny per barrel
