for the establishing a composition of tythes in
Ireland for a limited time to ascertain and
fix a true and just composition for all tythes
whatsoever arising, growing, yielding, ~~or payable~~
or payable within the parish of Litrin
County of Galway, Do hereby certify that the
true & just amount of composition for all
Tythes whatsoever within the said Parish
is seventy four pounds five Shillings &
ten pence - Fifty nine pounds five Shillings
& ten pence are due & payable to the Revd
John Armstrong Rector & vicar of said
Parish & fifteen pounds Sterling are due
& payable to the ~~Revd~~ Bishop of Clonfert
and we do further certify that the average
of oats, being corn principally grown in such
County for the period of seven years ending on
the first day of November ^{1821 or 24} is fifteen Shillings
& ~~four~~ ^{five} pence farthing per barrel
