

We the Reverend Cesar Conway, John Stewart
and James Colthurst Commissioners duly appointed
and sworn under and by Virtue of an Act
made in the fourth year of the Reign of King
George the Fourth Chap. 99, intituled "An Act
to provide for the Establishment of Compositions
for Tythes in Ireland for a limited time" and
an Act made in the fifth year of the said Reign
Chap. 63, intituled "An Act to Amend the said
first mentioned Act" to ascertain and fix a true
and Just Composition for all Tythes arising
growing yielded or payable within the Parish
of the Union of Leixlip in the Counties of
Dublin and Kildare, Do hereby Certify that
the true and Just Amount of Composition for
all Tythes whatever within the said Parish
of the Union of Leixlip is Seven Hundred
Pounds by the Year of which sum of Seven
Hundred Pounds, the sum of Fifty Pounds
is due and payable to the Very Reverend
the Dean of Saint Patrick's as Rector of that
part of the Parish of the Union of Leixlip
called Esker, and that the sum of Six
Hundred and fifty pounds is due and payable
to the Reverend Henry Stewart Rector and Vicar
of the said Union, -

And We do further Certify that the average
price of wheat being the Corn principally grown
in such Counties for the period of seven years
