

I Roger O'Beame a Commissioner duly appointed
and sworn under and by virtue of an Act passed
in the Reign of his Majesty King William the fourth,
"Chapter one hundred and thirteen" to amend three
Acts passed respectively in the fourth, fifth, and in the seventh
and eighth Years of the Reign of King George the fourth
providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes
in Ireland, and to make such Compositions permanent
to ascertain and fix a just and true Composition for all
Tithes arising growing yielded or payable within the
Parish of Lettermuckanward in the County of Donegal
do hereby Certify that the true and just amount of
Composition for all Tithes whatsoever within the said
Parish of Lettermuckanward is Eighty nine Pounds Eight
Shillings and Seven Pence Sterling by the Year, which
said Sum of Eighty nine Pounds Eight Shillings and
Seven Pence is due and payable to the very Reverend Lord
Edward Chester, Dean of Raphoe, as a Composition for the
Tithes claimable by him as Rector of said Parish, or by the
Reverend James Kilpatrick, Perpetual Curate of said
Parish including Two Pounds Sterling being the Tithes of the
Glebe Lands of said Parish, and I do further Certify, that
the average Price of Oats, being the Corn principally grown
in said County for the Period of Seven Years ending on the
first day of November one Thousand Eight Hundred
and Thirty is Eleven Shillings and two pence per
Barnes of fourteen Stone to the Burrell. Given under
my Hand this Twenty third day of August one Thousand
Eight Hundred and Thirty three
