~~of~~ do hereby Certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all tithes whatever within the said parish is Ninety  
 four Pounds Six Shillings Sterling by the year, of which sum of Ninety four Pounds Six Shillings, Nineteen Pounds Sterling is  
 due and payable to Dennis Browne as <sup>Rector</sup> ~~Dean~~ of said Parish, Twenty five Pounds Six Shillings is due and payable to Alexander  
 Macaulay and his Successors as <sup>1<sup>st</sup> Vicar</sup> ~~Curate~~ of said Parish, Twenty five Pounds Sterling is due and payable to the Bishop of Clonfert  
 and his Successors, Twenty five Pounds Sterling is due and payable to Thomas Hawkins as Dean of Clonfert and his Successors.  
 We do further Certify that the average price of oats being the Corn principally grown in said County for the period of seven  
 years ending on the first day of November 1825 is ten shillings by the Barrel, Signed sealed and delivered this <sup>twenty</sup>  
 5<sup>th</sup> day of October 1825 five
