William Stack Commissioner being duly appointed  
and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the  
4<sup>th</sup> year of the Reign of King W<sup>m</sup> the 4<sup>th</sup> entitled an  
Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the 4<sup>th</sup>  
5<sup>th</sup> 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> years of the Reign of His late Majesty  
King George the 3<sup>rd</sup> providing for the establishing of  
Composition for Tithes in Ireland and to make such  
Compositions permanent to ascertain and fix a true and  
just Composition for all Tithes arising growing yielded  
and payable within the Parish of Lisleary and County  
of Cork do hereby certify that the true and just amount  
of Composition for all Tithes whatsoever within the  
said Parish is Two Hundred and Forty pounds Sterling  
and that five ninth parts is due and payable to the  
Rev. John Busted as a Composition for Tithe claimable  
by him as Prebendary of said Parish, and that four ninth  
parts is due and payable to the Vicar or the Ecclesiastical  
Commissioners of Ireland for said Parish, and I do  
further certify that the average price of Wheat being the  
Corn principally grown in such County for the period of  
Seven years ending on the 31<sup>st</sup> day of October 1830, is  
£1.12.10<sup>7</sup>/<sub>4</sub> per Barrel, dated this 24<sup>th</sup> day of April  
1835,
