We Edgeworth Whelan and George Sherwood Commissioners duly appointed  
under and by Virtue of Acts made in the 4th and 5th years of the reign of King George the 4th  
intended to provide for the establishing of composition for tithes in Ireland for a limited  
time, to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all tithes arising, growing, yielded or  
payable within the Parish of Lisdoon in the County of Wicklow. Do hereby Certify that the true  
and just amount of composition for all tithes whatever within the said Parish is one hundred  
and fifty pounds Sterling Annually, of which sum of one hundred and fifty pounds Sterling  
Annually the Rev. James W. G. as Vicar of Lisdoon is entitled to one third or a sum of  
fifty pounds Sterling Annually, and the Rev. W. Morgan as Rector under the Dean and Chapter  
Leighlin of the Rectorial tithes is entitled to two third parts or a sum of one hundred  
pounds Sterling Annually, and We do further Certify that the average price of Oats  
being the corn principally grown in said Parish in said County for the period of  
seven years ending on the first day of November One thousand eight hundred and Twenty  
nine (as extracted from the Dublin Gazette) is fifteen shillings and two pence farthings  
morning per barrel, Given under our hands this sixteenth day of June One  
thousand eight hundred and Twenty nine
