of oats being the corn in said  
Certificate of said Lewis  
Fitzmaurice mentioned for the  
seven years preceding inquired  
of and ascertained in order  
that such composition and the  
Rent charges now payable in  
lieu thereof in said Parish might  
be varied and increased or diminished  
for the seven years next ensuing  
the

the 1st day of November 1896  
in proportion to said average  
price and to have said  
composition and Rent charges  
varied and increased accordingly  
so far as the same are liable  
to variation. And whereas  
afterwards in pursuance of said  
notice Richard Lane Warren  
Henry Charles Warren and Henry  
Standish Barry duly made  
application in writing for the  
purposes aforesaid to the said  
Justices of the Peace for the  
County of Cork assembled at said  
General Quarter Sessions of  
the Peace held at Middleton in  
and for said County and in  
and for Cork County East  
Riding and Division of Middleton  
on the 3rd November 1896. And  
whereas said application was  
then and there duly entertained  
by said Justices and was by  
order of said Justices duly  
adjourned to the next ensuing  
General Quarter Sessions of the  
Peace
