for tithes in Ireland for a limited time, to ascer-
tain and fix a true and just composition for
all tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable
within the Parish of Lisurakerry in the County
of Limerick, do hereby certify, that the true
and just amount of composition for all tithes whatso-
ever within the said Parish is one hundred and eighty
pounds Sterling British currency by the year - ~~which~~
~~sum~~ is for the term of seven years from the first
day of November next - which sum is due and
payable to the Rev. Richard Murray as Rector of said
Parish. And we do further certify, that the average
price of wheat, being the corn principally grown in said
County, for the term of seven years ending on the first
day of November 1821 was one pound eighteen shillings
and eight pence ^{halfpenny} per Barrel (late Irish currency) -
dated this 17th day of May 1827 -
