

Certificate of Composition for the  
Tithes of the Parish of Sismullin in the  
Diocese of Cashel & County of Tipperary

We James Purfoy Esq and William Palmer Esquires  
Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by  
virtue of an Act made in the Fourth Year of the Reign  
of King George the Fourth, intituled, "An Act to provide  
for the Establishment of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland  
for a limited time" to ascertain and fix a true and just  
Composition for All Tithes arising, growing, yielded, or payable  
within the Parish of Sismullin in the County of Tipperary,  
Do hereby Certify, That the true and just Amount of  
Composition for All Tithes whatsoever within the said Parish  
is, Three Hundred and Sixty Four Pounds Seventeen  
Shillings and Two Pence Sterling by the Year; Which Sum  
of Three Hundred Sixty Four Pounds Seventeen Shillings  
and Two Pence is due and payable to the Venerable H.  
Cotton, Archdeacon of Cashel, as a Composition for the  
Tithes claimable by him as Rector and Vicar of the said  
Parish of Sismullin.

And We do further Certify, that the average price  
of Wheat, being the Corn principally grown in such County  
for the period of Seven Years ending on the First day of  
November Eighteen Hundred and Twenty One, according to the  
Schedule thereof furnished by the Right Honble Henry Goulburn Chief  
Secretary to the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, is One Pound Fifteen Shillings  
& Eight pence Three Farthings British, or One Pound Eighteen Shillings  
& Eight pence halfpenny Irish per Barrel. Sismullin 21<sup>st</sup> April 1826
