

We John Musgrave and Thomas Foley (Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by Virtue of an act made in the fourth year of the Reign of King George the fourth entitled "an act to provide for the establishing of Compositions for Tythes in Ireland for a limited time" to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tythes arising growing yielded or payable in a certain distinct district in the Parish of Lismore and Macollop consisting of the Town Lands hereinafter mentioned and their Subdivisions and also out of the Blackwater Salmon Fishery within said Parish all in the Diocese of Lismore and Counties of Waterford and Cork Do hereby certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tythes (whatever within or out of said district and Salmon Fishery) is one Thousand seven Hundred pounds per annum as agreed upon at a Special Vestry duly held pursuant to said act in the Cathedral Church of Lismore on the first day of November one Thousand eight hundred and twenty four. And we further certify that the entire Tythes arising out of Shanley Garrinagore O'Neil and Bungeys Land of Lismore except the castle quarter Ballysaggartmore Coolishall the two Ballyduffs Glanbeg Kellopsody part of Littlepace and a small part of Ballinlucane called Lyre are payable to the Vicar Choral of the Cathedral Church of Lismore we further certify that the entire Tythes arising out of Ballyquellan (being the Treasurers Land) the Chanters Land and Archdeacons Glebe and Glunnonismens belong to the Oeconomy and are payable to the Dean and Chapter of said Cathedral we further certify that of the Tythes of Lyricken one half belongs to the said Oeconomy and is payable to the said Dean and Chapter and the other half is payable to the said Vicar Choral we further certify that of the Tythes of the Lands next hereinafter mentioned and the said Salmon fishery two thirds belong to the said Oeconomy and are payable to the said Dean & Chapter and the remaining one third is payable to the said Vicar Choral viz. Affane Norisland Ballyankier Ballymadraun Ballygas Ballygin and the said Salmon fishery Ballygattand Ballyrafter Ballysaggartlagh Ballinvelva Ballinaspy Ballygomash Ballynaron the two Priories Ballinlucane (except a part called Lyre)
