 payable to the said Dean and Chapter and Vicars Choral either wholly or
 or in the same proportion in which the Tithes arising out of said Lands and
 fishing respectively were payable as hereinafter is mentioned and we Certify
 that the sum payable to the Dean and Chapter as aforesaid is to be the
 Composition for all the Tithes of the Economy of the said Cathedral ^{and}
 within the said Parish of Lismore and Mocollop and that the sum payable to the said Vicars Choral is to be the Composition for
 for all Tithes payable within the said Parish of Lismore and Mocollop
 to the said Vicars Choral and we further Certify that the first half
 yearly payment of said Annual Sum of One Thousand seven hundred pounds
 shall be due and payable as aforesaid on the first day of November
 next and we do further Certify that the Average price of Oats being the
 Com principally grown in each of said Counties for the period of seven years
 ending the first day of November one Thousand eight hundred and twenty five
 is fifteen Shillings and two pence farthing per Bunch according to the
 average prices stated in the Dublin Gazette within said period
 Dated this sixteenth day of April One thousand eight
 hundred and twenty five -

At a special Vestry held in the Vestry Room in the Cathedral Church
 of Lismore on the twenty fifth day of April 1825 pursuant to due
 notice to take into Consideration the Certificate of John Musgrave
 and Thomas Foley Esqrs Commissioners appointed pursuant to an Act of
 Parliament passed in the 4th Year of the reign of King George the
 Fourth entitled an Act to provide for the Rehabilitation of Compositions
 for Tithes in Ireland for limited time, the said Certificate bearing date
 the sixteenth day of April 1825. Specifying the amount to be
 paid to the Dean and Chapter and Vicars Choral of said Cathedral
 as agreed upon at a former special Vestry held on the first day of
 November 1824 as the Composition for all Tithes payable to the said
 Dean and Chapter and Vicars Choral within said Parish of Lismore and
 Mocollop and of the Rectorial glebe fishing within said Parish and
 also specifying the several subscriptions in which the said Dean and Chapter
 and Vicars Choral were respectively entitled to the said Tithes to be paid
 for was laid before the special Vestry consisting of Richard Musgrave Esq
 Samuel Gurney George Maxwell the Revd James Mackintosh Walter and Henry
 Walsh Esqrs and the following Clergymen being also present
 the Revd Mr John Jett Dean the Revd Charles Mackay Treasurer for the
 Dean and Chapter and the Revd Daniel Sullivan Vicar Choral

It was then unanimously agreed that the said Certificate
 of said Commissioners should be confirmed in Witness whereof the
 undersigned Vestrymen and Clergymen have hereunto set their hands and
 seals this day and year first above written
