

I James Fraser Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an act passed in the 2^d and 3^d years of the reign of his present Majesty King William the fourth entitled "an act to amend three acts passed respectively in the fourth, fifth, and seventh and eighth years of the reign of his late Majesty King George the fourth, providing for the establishing of composition for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such compositions permanent" to ascertain and fix a true & just composition for all Tithes arising yielding growing or payable within the parish of Litter and County of Cork, do hereby certify, that the true and just amount of composition for all tithes whatever within the said parish is Six Hundred and Eighty one Pounds by the year, of which sum three Hundred and ninety three pounds are hereby due and payable to the Rev^d. James Mockler as a composition for the Tithes claimed by him as Rector & Vicar of the said parish, being in equal proportions for these fees respectively, and two Hundred and eighty eight pounds are hereby due and payable to John Mason Esq^r. as a composition for the Tithes claimed by him as lay Impropriator of said parish.

And I do further certify, that the average price of Wheat, being the corn principally grown in said County, for the period of seven years ending the 1st of November 1830. — is one pound twelve Shillings and a halfpenny per barrel.
