Reign of King George the fourth Intituled an Act to provide  
for the establishing of composition for tythes in Ireland for  
a limited time to ascertain & fix a true and just compo-  
sition for all tythes arising growing yielded or payable  
within the Parish of Loughrea in the County of Galway  
do hereby Certify that the true and just Amount of  
Composition for all the tythes whatever within the Said  
Parish is one hundred and Sixty seven Pounds nine  
Shillings and ten Pence half Penny by the Year  
of which Sum one hundred and forty two Pounds  
nine Shillings and ten Pence half Penny are due and payable  
to the Rev<sup>d</sup> Denis Brown as a Composition for the  
tythes claimable by him as Rector of the Said Parish  
And twenty five Pounds is due and payable to the  
Very Rev<sup>d</sup> Dean Hawkins as Dean of Clonsfert  
And we do further Certify that the Average Price  
of wheat being the Corn principally grown in Such  
County for the Period of Seven Years ending on the  
thirty first of October 1821 is one Pound eighteen  
Shillings and eight Pence half Penny per Barrel  
Given Under our hands and Seals
