May it please Your Excellency
and Lordships.

In obedience to the Order of Your Excellency and Lordships bearing date the 3^d day of May Instant, We have taken into consideration the Report of The Lord Bishop of Killaloe and Clonfert bearing date the 29th day of March 1858 received in the Council Office on the 31st of same month setting forth that an Order had been made by his Lordships for Episcopally uniting the Parishes of Loughrea, Kilteshill, Kilsconickony, Lickering, Killeenadeema, and Killeckle, in the Diocese of Clonfert now vacant by the death of the Reverend Samuel Medlicott the last Incumbent thereof, and that the said Parish of Loughrea and the other Parishes are contiguous; that the Church is in the Parish of Loughrea sufficiently near for the Parishioners to resort thereto for Public Worship and that there is no Glebe House and also setting forth several other matters and things relating to the said Parishes which for convenience sake We have condensed in the subjoined Table
