

serious evil, is of less magnitude than a total privation of the means of public worship and of spiritual instruction to which a great portion of these Parishes must now be necessarily exposed. Perhaps it will not be impossible to find some temporary place of worship answering in some degree the requirements of the population until a more proper and suitable structure can be erected.

Being then of opinion, for the present at least, and until Your Excellency and Lordships shall have heard from the Lord Bishop some facts or reasons shewing a strong necessity for the proposed union of the six Parishes, that such a course is not advisable, We humbly recommend to Your Excellency and Lordships that that Union should be disapproved.

We beg also to recommend that a copy of this Report shall be forwarded to the Lord Bishop of Killaloe.
