


Philip B. Dwyer Greene (Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the second and third years of the Reign of his present Majesty King William the Fourth "intituled an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the fourth and fifth and in the seventh and eighth years of the Reign of his late Majesty King George the Fourth providing for the establishing of compositions for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such compositions permanent"

To ascertain and fix a true composition for all Tithes growing, yielded, or payable within the Parish of South in the County of South, Do hereby certify that the true and just composition for all Tithes within the said Parish is Two Thousand and one Hundred and Fifty five Pounds Two Shillings & four pence by the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty Eight Pounds one Shilling & nine pence of which is due and payable to the Rev^d Thos Mackenay as Rector of said Parish, and One Hundred and Sixty seven Pounds and seven pence to Edward Botton (five Esh as a Lay Impropriator of certain Lands within said Parish

And I further certify that the Average price of Wheat being the Corn principally grown in this County for the period ending 1st November 1830 is One Pound Twelve Shillings and one half penny per Bussel
