Yielding or payable within the Parish of Lugan in  
the County of Dubon has been mutually agreed  
upon between the Rev<sup>d</sup> John Rowley Rector and  
Vicar of said parish and <sup>the</sup> Land holders, to the Amount  
of Two Hundred and fifty pounds Sterling by the year  
And we do further Certify that the Average price of Oats  
being the Corn principally grown in this Country for  
the seven years Ending the 31<sup>st</sup> October in the year 1821  
is fifteen Shillings and two pence by the <sup>W</sup>Paull  
According to the return advertised in the Dublin Gazette  
for the said years,
