the Fourth year of Geo. 4<sup>th</sup> (Intituled an act to provide  
And to ascertain and fix a true and Just Composition  
for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable  
within the Parish of Lismagh in the Kings County  
Do hereby Certify that the true and Just Amount of  
Composition for all Tithes chargeable, within the Said  
Parish, is £113-0-0 by the year of which sum of  
One Hundred and Thirteen Pounds, the sum of Twenty  
Eight Pounds is due to the Incumbent by the year, as a  
Compensation for all Tithes due to him in Said Parish  
and the sum of Twenty Pounds to the Bishop of Clonfert, as  
a Compensation for all Tithes due to him in Said Parish,  
and the sum of Fifteen Pounds to the Archdeacon of Clonfert  
as the Compensation of all Tithes due to him in Said Parish,

And we do certify that the average price of Wheat is  
£2-2-0 the average price of oats is 0-10-0 each per Bushell  
being the Corn principally growing in Said Parish
