We, John Low and George Langan, Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the Reign of King George the Fourth, intituled, "An Act to provide for the establishment of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time," to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of Marctown in the County of Meath, do hereby certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatsoever within the said Parish is Sixty eight pounds by the year; of which sum of sixty-eight pounds, Fifty pounds by the year are due and payable to the Marquis of Drogheda or his Representative as owner of the Rectorial Tithes of said Parish, eight pounds by the year are due and payable for that portion of the Tithes claimed by the Reverend Richard Radcliffe, Incumbent of Skryne, and Ten pounds by the year are due and payable to the Reverend St. George Caulfield Irvine the Vicar of the said Parish.

And we do further certify that the average price of Oats, being the Corn principally grown in such county for the period of Seven years ending on the First day of November one thousand eight hundred and twenty one is Fifteen shillings and two pence farthing per Barrel.
