Thirty Pounds British by the Year due and payable to the Rev.  
Thomas Newnham for the Tithes claimable by him as Vicar of  
said Parish.

and we do further Certify that the average price  
of oats, being the Corn principally grown in such County, for  
the period of seven years, ending on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of November  
1821. is fourteen Shillings and one farthing British by the Bushel.
