for a limited time: to ascertain and fix a true
and just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing,
yielded or payable within the Parish of Macronee
in the County of Cork. Do hereby Certify that
the true and just amount of Composition for
all the Impropriate Tithes of said Parish
is Two hundred and Thirty Pounds British
by the year, due and payable to the Impropriator
William Roche, Noble Roche, Francis Roman Roche, Sophia Roche, Edmund Roche
Roche & Richard Boyle Roche ✓

And we do further certify that the average
price of oats, being the corn principally grown in
such County, for the period of seven years, be-
-gining on the 1st day of November 1824, is Twente
Shillings and one farthing British by the
Barrel.

for the purpose of taking into Consideration the above Certificate
The Cur of Mount Cashel in the Chair
Resolved that on behalf of the Owners and Occupiers of Land
in said Parish of Macronee we assent and agree to the payment
of the above mentioned sum of Two hundred and Thirty pounds
British by the year as a Composition for the Impropriate
Tithes of said Parish. And we further consent on behalf
of such Owners and Occupiers of Land that the said compo-
-sition shall be invariable for Twenty two years from that
day of November next, and shall continue to be being without
any Variation in amount whatever the price of corn may be.
